ABC Head Start works with low-income families and their preschool children to achieve success in learning and life.

Growing Successful Learners

- Children participate in a 'learn through play' classroom experience, from September to June.
- Children are in either morning or afternoon classes.
- Children's learning is supported through daily nutritional snacks, field trips and a rich variety of learning experiences.
- Children with special needs receive a variety of special services including speech therapy.
- Children have lots of adult support in small classes with qualified staff, parent volunteers and trained community volunteers.

Nurturing Healthy Families

- Regular parent days and in-home visits provide opportunities for support and information sharing.
- Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's learning and development.
- Parents may volunteer in the classrooms, with our Board, committees and fund raising events.

Developing Supportive Communities

- Community volunteers play a vital role assisting in the classroom and in other key support roles.
- Community partnerships provide a support network for children and families.
- Scarecrow Festival volunteers and community supporters raise funds critical to our program.

To Qualify

The child must be at least 3 years 6 months old by September 1st.

Family income must fall within low income guidelines.
