## FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Diverse, intercultural and transitional - all words to describe the past year at ABC Head Start Society. The children and families we are supporting are coming from all over the world bringing their talents, perspectives and dreams. To meet new challenges, we are making changes to our policies, programs and investing in the well-being of our employees.

ABC Head Start Society is focusing on innovation, partnerships and collaboration. We have implemented two new programs, refocused our efforts to strengthen our family engagement services and empowered our dedicated staff to be more engaged in local neighbourhoods, groups and communities.

As the number of refugee families across the world increases, ABC Head Start Society has seen a dramatic shift in the families we are serving with 85% reporting a country of origin other than Canada. This brings a great complexity of family needs; therefore, we have forged new partnerships with other immigrant serving organizations, mental health services, the City of Edmonton and cultural coalitions.

We are proud to have opened our \$25 a day child care centre, 123 Grow Child Development Centre, in Fort Saskatchewan. We were first awarded the grant in 2017, and opening the centre presented several challenges. However, we are happy to announce our doors opened in September of 2018, and already have a wait list of over 30 families. The community of Fort Saskatchewan, its leaders, businesses and service providers have been welcoming, and we look forward to strengthening and building future partnerships.

Our resolve to support our society's most vulnerable children and their families remains. We intend to forge a new service delivery model to address the issues which impact early learning such as poverty, infant mental health, trauma, intercultural and intergenerational support.

#### **ABC Family Circle Begins**



In the summer of 2018, ABC Head Start Society launched a brand new program called ABC Family Circle. The planning for this new initiative started in September of 2017 while sifting through studies and surveys completed by ABC Head Start parents. A resounding number of parents talked about the need for a summer program to support the transition from Head Start to school, and to recognize that a family's complex needs did not just end because July arrived. A planning committee of staff and community partners formed and initiative began to take shape. They made it their goal to create an inclusive environment for families and reduce barriers for entry into the program.

A team of four staff and eleven volunteers worked with children and their families while fostering relationships with our partners throughout the summer. Ten of our volunteers were parents of children in the program, who collectively donated 439 volunteer hours. We served 40 children aged 6 mos. to 12 yrs. old, with a focus on outdoor play and opportunities to socialize and bond with other children. Many of the children over 6 yrs old attended BGC BIGS programming with one of our staff several times a week. There were also days when the older children chose to stay with their younger siblings at ABC Family Circle. The children from Peter Pan Daycare and families from the Capital Region Housing complex south of Millbourne Market Mall took part in all of our Friday gatherings, broadening the community reach of the Family Circle program and creating social connections to reduce isolation.

The generosity of the community was overwhelming. Donations from Edmonton's Food Bank, the Mill Woods Farmer's Market, Zach's Famous Donair, Safeway and the Real Canadian Wholesale Club provided over \$8,000.00 in food for our program participants. We took part in the Food Bank's 'After the Bell' Program, sending children home with groceries each week. We piloted the ABC Halal Depot with WECAN Food Basket Society, providing fresh produce and halal meats to families at reduced rates. Over the summer we hosted 6 community BBQs serving halal meat, grilled veggies, and snacks to the neighbourhood, supported by many community volunteers and the City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Engagement program.



This incredibly successful initiative would not have been possible without our core supporters: The Butler Family Foundation, The John and Dianne Storey Family Foundation, The Melton Foundation and Edmonton Community Foundation's Vital Signs grant. We also received cash and in-kind donations throughout the summer from unexpected donors like MHK Independent Brokers, Northbridge Insurance, and private donors from the community.






TOP 5 LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH: Arabic, Somali, Urdu, Oromo, Punjabi




We support children by providing an early learning program that helps young children develop the critical thinking, language, social/emotional and physical skills they need to be successful.


Children we serve are experiencing developmental delays, social, emotional or behavioral problems.

#### Food For Thought


According to the Growing Food Security in Alberta Network (GFSA); Food Security can be described as the condition in which all people at all times can acquire safe, nutritionally adequate, and personally acceptable foods in a manner that maintains human dignity.

ABC Head Start Society knows that this is not the case for all Albertans; especially some of the families we support. Food security is one of the growing challenges our families face. This year we worked hard to develop new partnerships with community organizations to address this challenge and help families acquire the food they need. This included new partnerships with COBS Bread Bakery, WECAN Food Baskets, Edmonton's Food Bank and Fort Saskatchewan Alliance Church - as well as an existing partnership with Rio Terrace Church.

**COBS Bread Bakery** - bi-weekly visits to pick up approximately 1000+ items. Each family who wishes to participate, gets a bag (sometimes two) full of bread & treats to take home.

**WECAN Food Baskets** - initiated a ABC Food Depot out of our Mill Woods location with Halal Food Baskets for families. This low-cost, cooperative buying allows families grocery money to go further and provides baskets of meat, fruit and vegetables.

**Edmonton's Food Bank** - provided nutritious snacks to our ABC Family Circle program and surplus of items such as baby food, to our Head Start program. **Fort Saskatchewan Alliance Church & Rio Terrace Church** - provides food hampers for families at Thanksgiving & Christmas.


